GLOSSARY	
Term	Definition
Screen	A Level I or Level of Care assessment
Admitting Facility	The identified nursing facility to which the person intends to be admitted
Clinical User	Staff person with clinical knowledge and understanding who can both complete and submit the screen to MAXIMUS
Community Placement	Any housing situation aside from hospital or nursing facility—this includes, but is not limited to, Assisted Living Facilities, Hospice, group homes, independent living homes, and senior communities
<b>Dual Diagnosis</b>	Mental Illness and Intellectual Disability/Related Condition
Executive Contact	Person responsible for signing the AP Administrator agreement—this is a supervisor or other senior management officer who attests the AP Admin has authority to submit screens on behalf of the facility/agency they are representing
Legal Guardian	The person or entity who is court appointed and legally responsible for decision making on behalf of an individual.
Level I	PASRR screening tool for persons admitting to Medicaid certified NFs, who have or may have a Serious Mental Illness (SMI), intellectual/Developmental Disability (ID/DD), or Related Condition (RC)



Level II	In depth PASRR evaluation for persons with a Serious Mental Illness (SMI), intellectual/Developmental Disability (ID/DD), or Related Condition (RC)
Non Clinical User	Staff person with no or limited clinical knowledge of the person who can enter information into a screen yet cannot submit the screen—only clinical users may submit screens in AssessmentPro
PASRR	Preadmission Screening and Resident Review
Provider	Health care provider or agency providing medical care or services
Queued for Review	Indicates a Level I and/or Level of Care have been submitted in AssessmentPro and the information provided requires a nurse to review the content prior to receiving an outcome determination
Referral Source	The person/facility/agency who submitted the Level I and/or Level of Care screen
Specialized Services	Intensive services exceeding those which can be provided by NF staff or rehabilitative services
Targeted Resident Review	A RR that is targeted for a subsequent review or quality check because certain markers are present (e.g. history of recidivism, aggression, etc.)
