

The Power of Pre-Admission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR)

Diversion & Transition

Goals

- To identify children and adults with mental illness and/or intellectual disability or a related condition
- To ensure individuals are placed appropriately, whether in the community or in a nursing facility; and
- To ensure that individuals receive the services they require for their condition(s)

Key Features:

A pre-admission screening is **required** prior to an individual being admitted to a nursing facility.

A resident review is required for a nursing facility resident to:

- Identify necessary service and support needs as status may change
- Ensure appropriate placement
- Coordinate transition planning back to the community
