GLOSSARY	
Term	Definition
<b>Access Site</b>	The CMHW Access Site is considered the single point of entry to explore a youth's eligibility from the CMHW program. The Access Site manages referrals, completes all necessary steps to assist families with applications, and completes statewide assessments for youth who are exploring their eligibility for the CMHW program.
<b>Access Site Coordinator</b>	An Access Site Coordinator supports youths and families throughout each step of the application process for Wraparound services. This includes gathering documentation to support the application process, completing an assessment that helps to determine if the youth is eligible for Wraparound services, providing information about Wraparound services, and connecting the youth and family to other services if they decide that Wraparound services are not a good fit.
<b>Child Mental Health Wraparound Portal</b>	A website where all referrals for the CMHW program are submitted and automatically linked to Tobi.
<b>Child Mental Health Wraparound Program (CMHW)</b>	Indiana's 1915(i) CMHW Services Program is a Home- and Community- Based Services (HCBS) program provided as a Medicaid State Plan service. CMHW services provide youth identified to have serious emotional disturbance (SED) home- and community-based wraparound services as an alternative to out-of-home residential care.
<b>Eligibility Review</b>	The Eligibility Review is a completed application for CMHW submitted by the Access Site that involves completion of a face-to-face evaluation, CANS assessment, and required forms, submitted in Tobi.
<b>Indiana 211</b>	Indiana 211 is a free service that helps connect Indiana residents to health and human services agencies and resources, including the CMHW program.
<b>Plan of Care (POC)</b>	A wraparound plan of care is a working document that will adapt and grow as the family goes through the phases of the wraparound process. It identifies the family's vision for their future, each individual's strengths, needs, and detailed strategies to meet those needs and accomplish that vision.
<b>Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED)</b>	Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) is a Medicaid-related term for a clinical determination that a child or adolescent has significant mental health needs due to a diagnosable mental health condition that results in functional impairment.
<b>Tobi</b>	Tobi is an electronic case records management system (database) the Division of Mental Health and Additional (DMHA) uses in operating the Child Mental Health Wraparound (CMHW) Services Program
<b>Wraparound</b>	Wraparound is a structured way to organize services and supports for families and young people with complex needs. The work in Wraparound is led by a Wraparound Facilitator and managed by a team of people that includes family members as well as other members from different parts of a family's life.  This team is committed to creating and carrying out a plan that focuses on meeting the needs of the entire family, not just the young person referred. The overall goal of Wraparound is to ensure that families realize their hopes and dreams, and experience success in their homes, communities, and schools. This intensive, creative team approach makes Wraparound unique.

<b>Wraparound Facilitator</b>	The Wraparound Facilitator supports families through each phase of Wraparound services. They are considered the first point of contact for Wraparound services and helps support the youth and family through sharing their story, developing and managing the plan of care and crisis plan, and making sure the family's voice is heard throughout the Wraparound process. The Wraparound Facilitator also communicates regularly with the family and other team members to check in around tasks from the plan of care and to prepare for monthly meetings.
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
