

How the SIS-A Helps Support Person-Centered Planning

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The SIS-A is a standardized assessment that provides important information about a person's support needs. While it informs the planning process, it does not determine the services an individual receives. As part of person-centered planning, the planning team uses this information, along with the person's goals, preferences, strengths, and other relevant factors to identify the services and supports that will best help the person live their best life.

In an effort to clarify some common misunderstandings about the SIS-A and its role in Person-Centered Planning, OADS has developed the linked documents below, which are also available on the SIS-A website.
